

A REVIEW OF JWARAHARA FROMULATIONS FROM ANCIENT TEXTS OF AYURVEDA

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ABSTRACT

Introduction: *Jwara* is due to depletion of digestive fire which results in formation of *Ama*. Primary principle in the management of *Jwara* is digesting the *Ama*, preserving the *Agni*, relieving *Shrotorodha*. For this, various drugs are mentioned in our treatises. Various treatises of Ayurveda mentioned different drugs/ formulations in accordance with *jwara chikitsa*. **Materials and methods:** All major texts of Ayurveda, journals and other sources. **Discussion:** *Acharya Charaka* has mentioned *Jwarahara Dashemani Mahakashaya* which exclusively deals with *Jwara*. Most of the drugs in *Jwara Chikitsa* mentioned by both *Charaka* and *Sushruta Acharyas* are *Tikta, Katu, Madhura Rasa. Ushna* or *Sheeta Virya, Katu Vipaka, Laghu Guna*. **Conclusion:** The main aim is to find out *Doshas* involved in *Jwara* and then plan the

treatment. Drugs mentioned in *Jwarahara Dashemani* as can be used as *Ekhmoolika Prayoga* (singly) or in combination based on number of *Dosha/Dushya* involved.

INTRODUCTION

Acharya Charka has explained *Jwara* in the beginning because among all the bodily diseases fever invades first and considered it as the '*Pradhana Vyadhi*' amongst all *Vyadhis*.^[1] Fever is a principle disease with response to any infection, tissue damage etc. Today we have incidence of different varieties of fever of various pathological entities. Fever may manifest

as a separate disease or even may as a complication. Ayurveda treatises mention in detail explanation about *Jwara*(fever), its *samprapti*(manifestation), treatment protocol etc.

Jwara Samprapti (Pathophysiology)

Doshas aggravated due to consumption of *Nidana* and during respective time, spreads to entire body and produces *Jwara*. Aggravated *Doshas* enters the *Amashaya* and combines with *Agni*, accompanying the *Rasa*, blocks the channels of *Rasa* and *Sweda*, impairs function of *Agni*(digestive fire) and expels out the *Agni* from the site of digestion and spreads to all over the body and gives rise to *Jwara*. *Doshas* exhibit its exacerbated symptoms and signs and brings abnormality in the skin, nail, eyes, tongue etc.^[2] Increased body temperature is a cardinal feature, despite increased temperature there is not sweat as the *Doshas* along with *Ama*'s block the *Swedavah Srotas*.

Types of *Jwara*

Almost in all *Ayurvedic Samhita*'s *Acharyas* have explained different types of *Jwara* such as *Ashta Vidha*, *Dvididha*, *Panchvidha* and so on. Main classification of *Jwara* according to *Acharya Charaka*^[4]:



1. Vataja
2. Pittaja
3. Kapaja
4. Vatapittaja
5. Vatakaphaja
6. Pittakaphaja
7. Sannipataja

MATERIALS AND METHODS

Prime sources for the study of *Jwaraghna* medicines were taken from *Ayurvedic* text *Charaka Samhita* and *Sushruta Samhita* and other article published in various journals.

RESULTS

Acharya Charaka has classified the *Dravyas* as per pharmacological actions into 50 *Mahakashaya*^[5] (50 groups of *Dravya*). Each group contains 10 *Dravyas* having particular action. Out of these 50 *Mahakashaya*, *Jwarahara Mahakashaya* is 39th number *Mahakashaya*.

DISCUSSION

Jwara is due to depletion of digestive fire which results in formation of *Ama*. Primary principle in the management of *Jwara* is digesting the *Ama*, preserving the *Agni*, relieving *Shrotorodha*. For this, various drugs are mentioned in our treatises. The mode of action of drugs in Ayurveda is explained on the basis of their *Rasa Panchaka*. Most of the drugs in *Jwara Chikitsa* mentioned by both *Charaka* and *Sushruta Acharyas* are *Tikta, Katu, Madhura Rasa. Ushna* or *Sheeta Virya, Katu Vipaka, Laghu Guna*. The *Tikta Rasa Dravyas* are best *Jwarahara Dravyas* as they are predominant of *Vayu* and *Akasha Mahabhuta* due to which they increases the *Agni*, destroy the *Ama*, and clear the *Rasavaha Srotas*. The *Tikta- Kashaya Rasa, Laghu-Ruksha Guna, Sheeta Virya* of drugs used in involvement of *Kapha- Pitta Dosha*. The drugs having *Ushna Virya* induces *Swedana, Deepana, Ama Pachana* and removes *Srotorodha* whereas *Sheeta Virya Dravyas* in reducing burning sensation in *Pittaja* dominant *Jwara*. Combination of all the drugs is used in involvement of all three *Doshas*.

Though *Guduchi*(*Tinospora cordifolia*) is mentioned as best *Jwaraghna* drug, other *tikta rasa* drugs are also advised to take like *Sariva*(*Hemidesmis indicus*) in case of *pitta* involvement,

Saptaparna(*Alstonia scholaris*) in *kapha* involvement, *Bala*(*Sida cordifolia*) in *vata*. Thus understanding the dosha, dhatu, avastha, kala, desha, bala are important factors before designing a drug/formulation in Jwara chikitsa.

CONCLUSION

The main aim is to find out *Doshas* involved in *Jwara* and then plan the treatment. Drugs mentioned in *Jwarahara Dashemani* as can be used as Ekhmoolika Prayoga (singly) or in combination based on number of *Dosha/Dushya* involved. The other *Kashaya Yogas* mentioned by both the *Acharya's* for treating *Jwara* are unique in their own way due their *rasa Panchaka*. We can further classify each Jwarahara Kashaya Dravyas based on their *Rasapanchaka*.

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
