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AYURVEDIC MANAGEMENT OF EKKUSHTA (CHRONIC PLAQUE PSORIASIS). A CASE REPORT

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ABSTRACT

Skin is a cover which protects us from various external invasions and one of all the organs skin is larger organ which is a link between internal and external environment of body. Skin is one which maintains beauty and personality. Changes in skin colour may be due to homeostatic imbalances in the body. Many factors affect health of the skin, including nutrition, hygiene, circulation, age, immunity, genetic traits, psychological state and drugs. In Ayurveda, the word 'Twacha' and chram is used for skin. All the skin diseases in Ayurveda have been discussed under the broad headings of Kushta. Psoriasis is described in Ayurveda as ek-kushta, it is type of kshudrakushta. ^[1] The number of people suffering from Psoriasis all over the world is increasing progressively and hence there is large number of drugs

mentioned in Ayurvedic texts, regarding the treatment of ek-kushta. Symptoms of ek kushta and psoriasis is alomost same that's why this is the case report of ek kushta treated successfully with ayurvedic therapy.

INTRODUCTION

Ayurveda, the ancient medical science which has its root in Vedas, the oldest available literature explains the health of an individual as the physical, mental, social and spiritual well-being. Ayurveda says "Dosha Dhatu Mala Mulam Hi Shareeram"

If any Dusti in this causes Vikaras to the individual. "Kushnati Shareerasya Shonitam Vikrute" means vitiation of Rakta Dhatu leads to Kushta.

Twak Vikaras Nidana are most commonly arises due to Mithyahara, Vihara, Manasika vitiate Tridosha which further leads to the affliction and aggravation of Rasa, Rakta, Mamsa and Lasika.

As per Ayurvedic texts, *Kushata* is a skin disease. ^[2] There are two types of *kushta*. *Mahakushta* and *Kshudrakushta*. *Mahakushta* is divided into seven and Kshudrakushta into eleven subtypes.

- 1. Mahakushta Kapala, Udumbhara, Mandala, Sidhma, Rushyajihwa, Pundarika and Kakanaka.
- 2. Kshudrakushta Eka, Charmakhya, Kitibha, Vipaadika, Alasaka, Dadru, Charmada, Paama, Visphota, Shataru and Vicharchika.

Eka- Kushtha is one among the eleven Kshudra Kushtha, which is characterized by Aswedanam (dryness), Mahavastu (sprads all over body), and Matsyashakalawat Twacha (skin resembles scales of fish), which means Kushtha. [3] It is painless, spreads all over the body area, and resembles fish scale, also in this, the skin becomes black and pink color.

The signs and symptoms of *Eka-Kushtha* (chronic plaque psoriasis) are similar to that of psoriasis explained in modern science.

Psoriasis is one of the most common dermatological condition affecting the most of the world's population. It occurs in all age groups and about inversely in men and women. It's a habitual, intermittent inflammatory disease of the skin. The exact aetiology is still unknown, but numerous precipitating factors like inheritable, environmental, immunological and psychological have been found to be influential in the expression of the disease Psoriasis has

been considered as psychosomatic disorder where the effect of psyche has been stressed in both Ayurveda and Modern Science.

MATERIALS AND METHODS

Method of sampling- simple randomized

Study design: Experimental clinical single case study.

CASE REPORT

History of Present Illness

A 40 years old male patient presented with reddish erythromatous plague on legs he was complaining of itching and burning sensation over there. On history patient had above complaints since 3 years. Patient took modern medicine but get only temporary symptomatic relief. Severity of symptoms increased day by days, So he came for our hospital for Ayurvedic treatment.

A chief compliants of chronic plaque over the knee joints, hands Vaivarnya (discoloration all overbody) with Kandu (powdery discharge with itching), Daha (burning sensation), and since the last 3 years.

History of Present Illness

Patient was well before 3 years. Since 3 years, he gradually developed plaques over the knee joints, hands, discoloration with itching and burning sensation.

He underwent various conservative treatments along with local application. But he did not get better relief.

Sleep: Disturbed due to itching.

Bowel: Constipation.

DISCUSSION

- 1. Aarogyavardhini vati possesses several pharmacological actions i.e. Kushthaghna, Dipan, Pachan, Medonashak, Hrudya, Sarvaroga prashamani, etc properties in Imbalance of Vata, Pitta and Kapha Aarogyavardhini vati balances these doshas in their normal limits, so it is the main part in treatment which is very important for any kind of chikitsa. Aarogyavardhini vati mainly works on increasing the agni so improves the function of Pitta dosha. In skin Bhrajak Pitta is there so it is very useful to maintain the normal and healthy texture of skin.
- 2. Aarogyavardhini vati is Rasakalpa. It cures skin diseases due to its purifying property. It removes dangerous toxins from body which is very effective for glorious skin.
- 3. Gandhak rasayan help to sustain the optimum status of raktadhatu also act as rasayan, due to its swedjanana activity, it removes pitta and kapha dosha from the body, and because of kadhughan property.
- 4. The Laghu Manjistadi Kwatha which have the properties like Agnidipaka, Raktashodaka, Samsrana, Pitta Kaphahara, Kustaghna, Kashaya, Tikta, Katu Rasa, Laghu Ruksha Guna, Usna Virya, Pittakapha Shamaka, Kustaghna, etc.
- 5. Dashang Lepa is an Ayurvedic *Lepa* (Semi-solid paste) containing ten ingredients which is anti-inflammatory, anti-bacterial and anti allergic in properties hence applied topically to treat various skin infections such as Visarpa (Herpes), Visha Visphota (skin eruptions

due to poison) and Dushta Vrana (non-healing wound)

Outcome of the Treatment

Erythematous skin (redness) was fully reduced after treatment, induration (thickness) was rough before treatment but it was reduced after three follow-ups, scaling was huge before treatment and it was fully reduced after treatment.

The patient had reported 90% improvement in his symptoms. He had got 80% relief from itching. The discolored skin andred scaly patches had been improved by 40%. The silver scales were reduced.

CONCLUSION

Eka kushtha (Psoriasis) though difficult to manage, but if proper diagnosis is made at proper time, it can give significant relief. And ayurvedic therapy shows highly significant results in ek-kushta (psoriasis)

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
